General Membership Meeting March 20, 2024 @ 1pm Meeting Notes

The March General Membership Meeting of the Northeast Florida Healthcare Coalition was held in-person at the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences. The meeting commenced at 1:00 pm on Wednesday, March 20, 2024.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by the Chair with a validation of members, with the following Executive Board members present. Quorum was met for voting.

*Approval of Minutes

The draft minutes from the February 21, 2024, Executive Board Meeting was provided as part of the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the draft minutes by Ronnie Nessler (Nassau County). A second was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). Motion carries.

FINANCIAL

*Budget Report

The finance report for February 2024 were presented by Leigh Wilsey.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the financial report by Ronnie Nessler (Nassau County). A second was made by Gavin Butler (St. Johns County). Motion carries.

Management and Administration

Board Updates

Staff shared that since the last meeting there have been changes to some of the voting members on the Board. St. Johns County appointing entities met and decided to update their representation. As of March 14, 2024, Gavin Butler with St. Johns County Emergency Management will be the voting member, and Lana Sample with the Florida Department of Health-St. Johns, will be the alternate voting member. Additionally, staff report there has been some interest from a long-term care representative to fill the LTC vacancy on the Board.

Website Updates

Staff report they continue to work with the website redevelopment company. The hope is to have the live website by April. The website will allow members to access meeting materials, training, exercises, and other helpful HCC information.

Project Funding Update

Staff report six projects have been reimbursed and completed – Flagler County Emergency Management (FirstNet miniCRD), Baptist Health System (PAPRs), Baker County Emergency Management (Training Manikins for MCI Exercises), Baker County Fire Rescue Department (MCI Trailer Replenishment), Lake Butler Hospital (Decon/MCI Equipment), and Dixie County Emergency Services (SimMan Training Manikin). Additionally, one project is in the process of reimbursement: AdventHealth Palm Coast Parkway (Decon Equipment). The two remaining projects are still in the process of procurement due to delays in supply chain/shipping but remain on track to be completed by May.

EMAG Conference – April 17-19, 2024

The EMAG Conference in Savannah, GA will be held April 17-19, 2024. Staff have registered all 26 individuals who expressed interest in attending. Staff look forward to having all these members in attendance, and to bring helpful information back to the entire membership following the conference.

Operational Response and Recovery Plan Updates

Per contract requirements, staff must update the Operational Response and Recovery Plan annually. The updated plan was shared with the membership via email in early March for review and input. The final plan was discussed at the March meeting and was approved by consensus.

New Contract (FY24-29)

Staff share they have not received the new contract yet but have heard from the State to expect level funding for the new contract. Once the contract is made available to HCC staff, there will be a strategic planning workshop with the Alliance Board's to review and discuss the five-year contract. Staff share there may be changes to project funding based on the new contract language, as future projects may have to be more regional in focus.

BUSINESS

*Approval of General Membership Requests

As required in the bylaws, the Board must approve all membership requests. There have been seven (7) membership requests since the last meeting. The list was provided in the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made by Gavin Butler (St. Johns County) to approve the new members. A second was made by Christopher Tytler (Hospitals). Motion carries.

TRAINING AND EXERCISE

BOLDPlanning

Staff report there will be upcoming virtual workshops through BOLDPlanning for the COOP planning platform, this will include initial and midterm planning workshops. Once made available, the HCC will also provide initial and midterm planning workshops for the EOP platform.

CDP Virtual Training Offerings

Staff share the upcoming virtual training opportunities offered to anyone in Florida through the Center for Domestic Preparedness. Trainings include Prehospital Mass Casualty Incident Operations, Healthcare Facility Mass Fatality Management, Active Shooter/Assailant: Behavioral Indicators and How to Respond, Special Needs Population Considerations During Emergency Response, and Psychological Preparedness for Responders. The flyer with more course information and registration links is attached to the minutes.

CISA De-escalation Workshops @ May Meeting

In partnership with CISA, there will be workplace violence de-escalation training offered following the May HCC meetings. The training will be in-person only. The flyer with more information and the registration link is attached to the minutes.

MRSE Exercise

Staff share the upcoming MRSE exercise on May 7th is an annual contract requirement and requires a 20% surge of staffed hospital beds. This year the Coalition will be hosting it in conjunction with Marion County. More information to come if other members can attend to observe or evaluate.

Tropical Tango – Virtual TTX Series

Staff share the last virtual tabletop exercise opportunity for the fiscal year which will be held in June. This scenario will be weather-based and will help participating facilities think through a possible evacuation.
